TARGETING TERRORISM AND CRIME 1-800-492-TIPS (8477)

The Maryland State Police is committed to working with federal, state and local law enforcement to prevent the threat of terrorism and reduce violent crime in our state. You can also have a vital role in our efforts to keep the state safe.

The Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center, a joint law enforcement operation, maintains an around-the-clock tips line (1-800-492-TIPS) for people to call with information about suspicious persons or circumstances that may be related to terrorism or other criminal activity. All information is taken seriously and will be investigated.

Do not ignore your feelings of uneasiness about a person or circumstances you may encounter. If you observe someone or something unusual or suspicious, take the time to contact police and have the situation checked out.

MARYLAND'S CHILD AMBER ALERT

If police confirm a child abduction in Maryland, believe the child is in serious danger and there is descriptive information about a suspect and/or vehicle, the AMBER Alert will be activated. Lookouts will be broadcast on radio and television. Highway message signs will read "Child Amber Alert" and give a description of the suspect vehicle. If you see that vehicle, please dial 9-1-1.
